# **UPDATE FROM ST ANNE'S**

Churches are expected to make a 'donation' for Diocesan services, which includes the priest. The Parishioners of St Anne's have taken the bold step to reduce this donation or 'Parish Share', as it is officially termed, by 25%.

For over 2 years, St Anne's has shared a priest with five other churches in the South Lakes Benefice (Bowness, Windermere, Troutbeck, Ings, Staveley, Kentmere). Whilst a new vicar will be appointed to the Benefice this Autumn, there has been a steady erosion of services such that even after the new appointment, each Church will only 'see' a clergy member on a Sunday morning twice a month. Clergy are, of course, additionally available for christenings, marriages and funerals whenever required.

In February 2023, the electricity contract for the Church will renew. The night-time / weekend rate for electricity, which is used almost exclusively because of the heat-pump and under-floor heating, will increase from 10.5p to 27.5p per unit. Annual heating costs will accordingly more then double from £1600 to £3800. In order to offset some of this cost, by around £1500 per annum, parishioners are in the process of seeking to install solar PV panels on the South facing roof and a storage battery. Planning permission for such an installation on a Grade 2\* listed building is not straightforward but it is strongly felt that the effort is worthwhile especially with the need to address 'climate change'. St. Anne's will announce a Solar Panel Fund in due course.

The reduction in the Parish Share donation will 'save' St Anne's £2500 per annum. This will offset some of the rise in energy costs and allow more to be placed in the Building Fund which is used to look after the building fabric and which, in due course, would be used to help pay for a solar PV installation. Ings PCC is at pains to look after the Church fabric and finances for the ongoing benefit of the whole community, not only for those who use it on a Sunday morning, but also for the services that mark birth, marriage and death, and the increasing 'non-church' use for concerts, plays, rehearsals, meetings and exhibitions.
