Unauthorised signage: We have thanked Richard Leafe (Chief Executive LDNPA) for getting his contractors to remove unauthorised signage from Ings as promised.





Application to LDNPA to divert a section of footpath away from the riverside in Ings: There was a site meeting to discuss the short section of footpath between the A591 and the church in Ings. it was concluded that the problem was caused when the A591 was built across the footpath route, causing villagers to stop using the footpath to walk to Church. The outcome is still pending.

Blocked drains: There has been a request to Cumbria Highways to clean out the Drains in both Staveley and Ings that are blocked as this adds to the flooding problem; the reference confirmation is EI/96809

Dogs in playground: There has been a complaint about dogs in Ings Village playground, this will be monitored in the future.

Warm space in Staveley and Ings: This was discussed at the Parish Council meeting and is now up and running in Staveley.
