WHAT'S ON

AGM - CHURCH and HALL - 26th March

As in most organisations, Ings Church and Hall are subject to annual review. The two separate accounts are scrutinised by an independent expert. Committees are elected for a further term of office; the Church committee (the Parochial Church Council) is elected from Church members. This is not the case for the Village Hall Committee. Reports of the year's activities are presented including one on the use of Church and Hall in community affairs:



"This year, for the first time since before Covid, a very successful Summer Fayre and Barbecue were held in early July, and for the second consecutive year we held a Christmas Fayre in late November. It was a pleasure to see both Church and Hall looking so busy during these events. During the year, the Church was host to 13 concerts which attracted a total audience in excess of 1000. The concerts provide for a wide variety of musical genre – from choirs to string groups, from pop, folk and rock to classical music. In addition to the evident pleasure with which the concerts are received, not only have they generated significant income for the Church, they have also enabled charitable fundraising of nearly £8000 for others. Church and Hall provide rehearsal space for many different music groups. The Church's wonderful acoustic and its excellent piano are a draw for workshops and masterclasses. In addition to the bands which rehearse regularly there, the Hall provides space for a toddlers' class and several exercise classes throughout the year. A well supported quiz night took place in April. Mothers Union meets there monthly as does Lunch Club. The Bateman Club's series of afternoon talks continues to thrive."

Next meeting: The next Parish Council meeting will be held in the Ings Village hall on Wednesday 5th April at 7.15. At the beginning of each meeting there is a public participation section, this is your opportunity to comment on planning applications, the community plan, the future of the Abbey and other important village issues. For more information on planning applications please see the web site or contact the Clerk.

Planning applications: Several of the planning applications discussed at the last meeting were objected to, some were supported. We were informed that an Ulverston man was fined for allowing a tree subject to a tree preservation order to be felled. It ended up costing him nearly £6000. A local property was issued with an enforcement notice for a breach of planning control. These actions show us that the Lake District National Park take planning issues very seriously.

River wall at Hall / Playground: In response to a request for an update on work to the river walls in Ings, we recently had a meeting with Stuart Newby, National Framework Manager for Volker Stevin Ltd, contractors to the Environment Agency on flood prevention work hereabout. We were informed that the flood plan and work to be done will be finalised during the summer. Only then will we be told when the work will be started. It was agreed that some temporary stabilisation and repair work will need to be done on the river wall by the hall outbuildings before the planned main project starts. It is currently very unstable.
