## WHAT'S ON



**CLEAN RIVER KENT CAMPAIGN** is a coalition of communities living along the river Kent, established in Autumn 2021 by a group of individuals that love our local river. The river Kent in Cumbria is a beautiful river, located in a world

heritage site, and designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) at a national level and a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) at a European level because of the unique ecology including freshwater pearl mussels, white clawed crayfish, and bullhead. The river Gowan which flows through Ings is an important tributary.

Our aim is to make the river Kent clean for all types of water-based recreation and to protect the ecology and wildlife in the river by working with local communities to campaign for:

- 1. A significant reduction in the discharge of effluent into the river
- 2. Improvements to the wastewater treatment works on the river:

To meet current needs and in addition

To meet the needs of new housing development

To meet additional pressures which will result from climate change

3. The protection of the river's ecology and wildlife.

CRKC is co-ordinated by a volunteer management group and has over 120 volunteers on our mailing list. Volunteers are helping our campaign in all sorts of ways, from organising crowd-funders, to undertaking citizen science water monitoring, helping with data analysis, organising events and helping with communications.

### **UPDATE ON TRAFFIC IN INGS VILLAGE**

There were over 20 comments on various matters of traffic in the village sent to the village email address, all of which were passed to our Parish Council. The messages raised a variety of concerns, including requests for one-way traffic, a pedestrian crossing for the A591, 20mph speed limits on the Gated Road and Grassgarth Lane, and safer access to and from the filling station complex. The Parish Council have taken forward the almost unanimous request / support for a 20mph speed limit in the village. I hope you will agree that this is a sensible first step. #### STAVELEY WITH INGS PARISH COUNCIL - LATEST NEWS

The minutes of 6<sup>th</sup> Nov are available on the website. Among the items discussed concerning Ings:

The speed indicator device installed by the Parish Council had been working well in reducing the speed of motorists, who in the past have increased speed after going through the speed camera in Ings.

It was noted at the meeting that someone had been **sleeping in the north side bus shelter** at Ings, the parish council left him an introduction letter to Manna House in Kendal who support homeless people, the letter had the phone number and address along with the bus fare, they also informed <a href="https://thestreetlink.org.uk/">https://thestreetlink.org.uk/</a> who offer a vital service in helping end rough sleeping.

Concern was again expressed regarding cars that were continually **parking on the verge at Ings**, this is being reported by the Parish Council.

Ings residents living adjacent to the River Gowan have been informed by the Environment Agency that they will be conducting survey and investigation work relating to the **planned flood prevention scheme**. See current information on http://thefloodhub.co.uk/upperkent/

It was reported at the meeting that the residents of Ings overwhelmingly supported a **20mph speed limit**. The Parish Council voted on the proposal and it was passed unanimously and will now be passed to Westmorland and Furness Council for action.
