SOLAR PANELS - APPEAL DISMISSED

The disappointing news that the Planning Inspectorate had dismissed our appeal to put Solar Panels on Ings Church came in late October. The decision by the National Park and the Planning Inspector are based on a subjective opinion of what 'looks good', one which both bodies agree creates 'less than substantial harm' to the architectural heritage. We understand that they are not obliged to consider any mitigating factors.

Are 'looks' really more important than the Climate Emergency? Of course, one St Anne's doesn't make much of a contribution on its own, but the cumulative affect of lots of St Anne's does. And is 'less than substantial harm' more important than the financial benefits solar panels bring to the communities that use buildings such as St. Anne's? Heating costs are an existential threat to listed churches and historic buildings, not just ours. Solar panels help make building usage affordable and that benefits the communities that use such buildings. Using them saves them from neglect, thus safeguarding their architectural heritage.

We're considering the next steps - we're not inclined to lie down quietly. All suggestions and help gratefully received.

The Parish council is looking for council members to join the Staveley with Ings Parish Council. On Monday the 25th of November there was an extraordinary meeting to discuss planning applications that could have been missed, as a parish council member you would have been (if appropriate) able to vote.

The Warm Space at the Staveley Institute is open to all residents of Staveley and Ings on Tuesday and Thursdays to drop in for a chat, a cuppa, a bowl of soup and a pudding, between 12.00 noon to 2pm.

Westmorland and Furness Council have introduced a Handyperson Scheme offering eligible residents help with things like Installing handrails, small repairs such as unblocking sinks or replacing tap washers also fitting minor security measures such as door or window locks. The work is carried out free of charge - you just provide the materials. This is available to people over 65 who have a disability or are vulnerable who meet the eligibility criteria.
