SOLAR PANELS - NEXT STEPS

Over recent months I have had conversations with many who have expressed their disappointment and frustration at the decisions by the National Park and the Planning Inspectorate to block our plans. Further, feedback from the report in the December 2024 Newsletter has encouraged us to provide an opportunity to both residents and non-residents, and to those who use St Anne's, to express their support in a petition which might be used as evidence, for example, in a future planning re-application, to write to the press, MP, etc.

Petition forms are now available. Paper copies will be delivered to all those who receive the paper copy of the Newsletter and will also be available in the Church and Parish Hall. Completed paper forms can be returned there. An electronic copy will be sent to those who receive an e-copy of the Newsletter. You are asked to support five main arguments in favour of our proposed solar panel installation:

- it reduces electricity costs making use of the Church affordable
- using the Church protects the fabric of the building, saving it from neglect thus protecting its architectural heritage
- the installation of solar panels on the south facing roof creates minimal visual impact, invisible for all who see St Anne's from the A591, and is completely removable, leaving no trace
- it supports St Anne's Church as an important, much-used and much-loved community asset, the only large public space in lngs
- generating low carbon energy to drive the existing heat-pump is an outstanding example of sustainable development in action

Hill Farm: It was noted that a further consultation on an application there had been received but the Parish Council had been unable to fully consider it at their November meeting. It was requested that the clerk seek an extension of time until after the January meeting, but if this was declined, then an extraordinary meeting would be considered.

St Anne's Church, Ings: Installation of a 28 panel array of solar PV panels on the South facing roof (appeal of 7/2023/5474) noted that appeal was dismissed 22/10/2024. Cllr Riley noted that this was considered a contentious decision and that the applicants were looking at options to challenge it.

Ings Playground: Mole eradication appears to have been successful. The damaged wall repairs commissioned and approved by the Parish Council have now been completed. Monthly playground checks have been carried out with no issues noted. Concern was expressed about the main gate being left open whilst children are playing. A sign is now attached to the gate. Hall users are requested to be vigilant.
